

Mid-Career Summer Research Program (MCSRP)

Purpose	The MCSRP provides funds to support selected faculty members at the rank of Associate Professor to advance their research, creative projects, and scholarship toward promotion to the rank of Professor.
Eligibility	 Open to Associate Professors holding a full-time, tenured position within AddRan College of Liberal Arts. Priority will go to the following: Faculty with more than five years in the rank of Associate Professor at TCU. Those not already receiving University/College summer funding (NOT including summer school teaching salary). Those receiving summer salary support from an external grant and/or contract remain eligible to apply for MCSRP support as long as the external grant does not compensate for 100% of their salary. Those who have not previously received a MCSRP award, though previous awardees may apply for a second MCSRP grant.
Award	The Dean will make five \$5,000 awards (summer stipends) annually (the University will withhold an 8% FICA contribution and taxes, but will not contribute to retirement benefits). Successful applicants may teach a summer class, but are restricted to one class in one of the regular summer school sessions, contingent upon departmental need and the availability of funding for summer school classes.
Application	A full proposal is required from each applicant and shall include an updated CV and a two-page narrative outlining the project, scope of work, goals, and anticipated results. <i>The application deadline is the first Monday in March</i> . Submit all materials combined in a single PDF document to Dr. Peter Worthing (<u>p.worthing@tcu.edu</u>).
Evaluation	The members of the AddRan Research and Creative Activity Committee will review and evaluate the applications. The committee will make recommendations to the Dean, based on the overall merit of the project with consideration for the aforementioned priorities. Applicants are encouraged to submit a RCAF proposal to complement the MCSRP application, which could provide funding for travel, supplies, or other items in support of the project. Notification of awards will take place before April 15.
Reporting	A final project report is due to the Dean's office no later than the end of October of the same year of the award. The report should describe the awardee's research activities during the award period and the accomplishments that resulted. Awardees should share their report with their department chair.
